Mahmoud Darwish (1941-2008) was an award-winning Palestinian author and poet. the Gulf of Mexico. Please continue to keep Pastor Laurie & Bryan, Jeff, Sherry, and the rest of the family in your prayers.



We did it! In January I was overwhelmed by the idea of hosting the groups May through August every Saturday morning. Thanks to the voluntary support of several FCC women, we greeted and registered attendees throughout the Saturdays of this four-month commitment. A special shoutout to Bobbi Hall who provided treats each week. The group moves to Plymouth Congregational beginning in September. We will be asked to host at SpringHouse again in about two years. Thanks again to the volunteers and the church board for supporting this wonderful service.

SpringHouse Board Notes

Thirteen SpringHouse board members and staff attended the August 18 meeting of the SpringHouse board at Minnehaha Falls Park. Items discussed included the following:

- The board discussed the possibility of having non-police security presence on Sunday mornings. Pastor Dan Adolphson said his would check with his contacts at a security firm he has worked with about rates for their services. Pastor Gail Irwin pointed out that Building Engineer Rick Bowman checks around the outside of SHMC each day, and Pastor Laurie Feille shared that staff has indicated they feel safe coming to work at SHMC.
- Emma Jorstad of Salem has drawn up goals for a SpringHouse Marketing Committee, which would involve brainstorming ideas about how SHMC can create more revenue to support our ministries. One or two representatives from each congregation are needed for this work. The group will choose online or in person meetings, whichever would work best, and will start as soon as possible.
- Treasurer Andy Rennert submitted an update on the current budget. The annual capital share contributions from each congregation have been covered. The budget is on track with income year-to-date and expenses are generally in line. We are about \$4K below on the utility budget currently.

Every Meal needs volunteers

Many of us heard the excellent speaker from **Every Meal** at Worship in the Park. FCC wants to be involved with the distribution again during the coming school year.

BUT! In order to know how many distribution weeks we can commit to (one or two per month), we need to know how many volunteers we have and an estimate of how often they can distribute food. Some points to remember if you are thinking about volunteering:

- From start to finish, there is a commitment of about 90 minutes. . The amount of time may vary; 90 minutes assumes about 70 children (last year's number).
- The usual distribution days are Fridays but holidays can change the days to Thursdays or very rarely, Wednesdays.
- Three people are needed per distribution. If you do not feel that you can lift a box or a bag, you can be the recorder of bags placed into lockers
- There are training videos to watch ahead of time and you will always be teamed with experienced people (and YOU may become one of those people!)
- You are not expected to participate in every distribution-unless you want to!

There will be a sign-up sheet on the website as soon as we know how many days we will be able to help with distribution.

Please contact Karen Kandik by Sept. 11 if you want more information or want your name on the volunteer list. Every Meal veterans guarantee that you will feel energized and fulfilled by participating!
