First Christian Church has supported the Groveland Food Shelf for years with donations and volunteers. Lots of changes have occurred in the past few years. They now provide fresh and shelf-stable groceries for 200+ of our church neighbors every weekday! That is twice as many as a few years ago. Guests pick out the food they want, shop without an appointment, and can visit every week if they need to. The food shelf, located in Plymouth Congregational Church, at Nicollet and Groveland in Minneapolis, operates Monday through Friday 9:30 am to 12 pm. Afternoon/early evening shifts are in the works.

Groveland really needs our help receiving food, stocking shelves, checking guests out, and just being all-around good stewards toward our neighbors. If you can volunteer your time for 2-3 hours weekly or monthly (a regular schedule is preferred but not required), Groveland would love your support. An exciting time to dream!

I keep trying to find the right words to offer thanksgiving and gratitude to our Narrative Budget Team. They gave the church a gift by creating and presenting to us a narrative budget. The only words I have are "Thank you!" and "Thanks be to God!" This team has worked for months and months to help us better understand our budget and what we as the congregation say are our priorities for the monies we have. They built upon the good work of the Congregational Survey team. They discovered that what the congregation says are priorities and values matched with our budget. That is wonderful! They then went to work to help us understand what those priorities look like in percentage of our budget and how those priorities are carried out in the life of the church. They created a narrative budget with a lot of prayer, humor, input from the congregation and creativity. Thank you, thank you, thank you to Arlene, Jen, Margaret, Tammy and Pat!

With a Narrative Budget we are now better able to talk and dream about how we use the gifts we have been given. Pat led an excellent discussion after worship on September 22 about all of our funds and what restrictions are tied or not tied to each fund. She shared what our budget could look like if we made no changes in our budget over the next year or two or if we became creative with the funds we have. She also shared that while we always welcome having new members and increases in giving, that alone will not make the changes to our budget that we need to continue the ministries that the congregation has said are important.

Here comes the fun part! We have the opportunity to get creative and in some ways rewrite how we use the gifts that we have received and will receive. The world in 2024 is different than the world in 1950 and it is an exciting time to dream and let the creativity of the congregation shine through!

Our Stewardship Invitation theme this year is "All Creatures Great and Small" and Psalm 104 is the scripture basis for the theme. Our Co-Board Chairs are sending a letter this week to the congregation inviting us to give and to be creative. Along with the letter is a pledge card, a time and talent card and a giving chart for reference. On October 13, we will offer our gifts of time, talent and money in response to all that God has created and continues to create in this world. We also give in the hopes of continuing the ministries of this church so that we might be a glimpse of God's love to a world that needs to know God's love is for all.

On October 20, we will gather for a worship of celebration of all of the gifts we have received. Stewardship time is not a time that pastors look forward to as usually there is talk of shortages and cuts ahead. This year I am very excited because while we have been honest about our budget our Narrative Budget Team has shown us that there is hope and joy ahead if we will be creative. Hurricane help through Week of Compassion

Hurricane Helene made landfall Thursday September 26 on the Florida Gulf Coast with massive 140 mph winds and 20 ft storm surges. Impact has been widespread and damage assessments are ongoing across the southeast U.S.

First Christian Board Notes

Seventeen board members and staff attended the September 17 meeting of FCC's general board via Zoom. Items discussed included the following:

• Co-Chair Martha Harris led a discussion about the process of revising the church's bylaws, last revised in 1997. Martha brought a motion to drop the section on having a standing Evangelism committee, and the motion passed unanimously. The board also discussed the possibility of having a Cabinet, but tabled this discussion for another meeting.

• Treasurer Pat Dunlop reviewed the budget summary sheet for August. Pledge receipts for the month came to \$17, 519. The general fund balance for the month was -\$4,139. She explained that the church borrows against its own dedicated funds to pay expenses, with the aim of finding a way to reimburse these funds at the end of the year.

• The SpringHouse board met August 18. A new Marketing Task force for SpringHouse is being started, and two members from each congregation are needed. Pastor Laurie reported that Nat Rosenberg and Lacey Athey have volunteered to be on this committee.

• Pastor Laurie expressed thanks to everyone who provided food, flowers and comfort during the days following her father's passing.



Donations delivered



Bylaws revision underway

The Bylaws of First Christian Church were last amended and approved in 1997. A lot has happened since then, including the move to the SpringHouse in partnership with two other churches. FCC's board voted to last February to set aside the bylaws in order to have time to revise and bring them up to date with current policies and practices. The various standing committees and groups are now in the process of examining their sections of bylaws to make revisions, and others on the board are combing through the bylaws document to reflect the current life and operations of the church. The goal is to bring the revisions to the congregation at the annual meeting in January, 2025.
